RENCEVATION READY

As winter turns to spring our attention is focused on our upcoming renovation project. Our plans to restore the architectural splendor, while providing modern amenities, are nearly completed. We are very excited about this project and feel that the renovation will enhance your library experience.

We are hosting 3 open houses to present our renovation project in detail. The projected cost for the renovation is \$1.7 million. The library currently has 60% of the necessary funds. This was achieved through the generous donations of our patrons. In addition to grant writing, we are respectfully requesting an overall budget increase of \$150,000 for the next 5 years. We will be using those funds to repay a five-year loan of \$750,000. The average homeowner should see an increase of approximately \$20 per year during the repayment of the loan. Any grant money received would allow us to repay the loan sooner than expected.


