## *A letter from the Board President*

On behalf of the Board of Trustees, the Director, and her incredible staff, I would like to say thank you for your support of our library and the upcoming renovation project.

The overwhelming support we received at the recent budget vote was gratifying. We met many of our patrons while unveiling our renovation project at numerous public meetings over the last several weeks. The comments and suggestions that we received have helped us to finalize our construction plans.

Some of you might have noticed that small changes have already occurred. The bars on the windows, that have been present since the building was a bank, have been removed. Our plan is to have the project put out to bid and start the con-

struction phase in November. The library building will be closed during the entire project, which we anticipate lasting a year.

The good news is that the temporary library will be located in Feather Hill. All of the Library's essential functions will occur in our new space and some group meetings will be held elsewhere. However, this summer and fall the library will be open and operating as usual.

Please stop by the library, or visit our new website, and enjoy all that the Southold Free Library has to offer.




