New York State Library Construction Grant

In September 2017 the Library applied for a New York State Library Construction grant through a program that offered \$24 million in grants for construction projects to New York State libraries.

We are very happy and proud to report that our grant request was accepted and we will be receiving \$270,000 to be used for the Library's renovation.

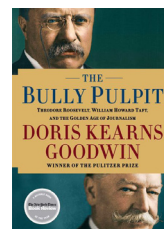

HURRICANE 1938 IMAGES

FROM THE WHITAKER HISTORICAL COLLECTION

A Storm Without Warning...

Headlines in the New York Times on the morning of Wednesday, September 21, 1938, reported that Hitler was gaining his first foothold in the Sudetenland. The front page weather brief read: rain, probably heavy, today and tomorrow; cooler.

The aftermath

- The one fatality on the North Fork was Emmett Young of Southold who was blown off the roof of his house.
- Store windows were blown out. Chimneys were blown off and roofs smashed by falling trees.
- More than 700 ancient elms were lost.
- The Great Hurricane of 1938 left a tremendous mess in its wake.

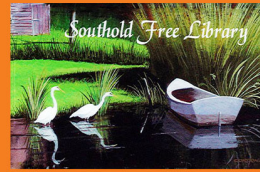
