## From the Board President

The Southold Free Library renovation is progressing nicely. We anticipate the grand re-opening by the end of this year. During the course of the renovation we have made some wonderful discoveries. Most significantly, during the demolition phase we discovered signatures from the construction of the original building, dated May 26, 1891. An interesting fact is that pencil, unlike pen, doesn't fade over time, so these signatures look like they were from yesterday. Photos of the signatures are available on our website: [www.southholdlibrary.org](http://www.southholdlibrary.org). While we are excited about the progress, we have run into some construction issues. Some were to be expected in the renovation of an older building and some were impossible to have foreseen. After demolition was completed, we noticed water intrusion in the front of the building. This required us to undertake a costly repair of the façade and roof portion of the building facing the Main Road. Another costly and unexpected issue has

been the potential impact of the tariffs imposed by the United States Government. This may cause a substantial cost increase in materials needed to complete the library renovation. We attempted to mitigate this issue by pre-purchasing as much material as we could prior to the tariffs taking effect. However, these issues have caused us to remove some aesthetically pleasing but not critically important portions of the project. Rather than request additional money from the taxpayers, we have embarked on fundraising efforts. Throughout this year you will see several opportunities to help us with our fundraising efforts. If you would like to donate, you can do so either in person, by mail or via our secure website. Thank you for your continued support. Without your assistance none of this would be possible.

These passes entitle you and your guests (check each pass for specifics) to FREE admission, and often include special exhibits and shows.


Southold Library is able to purchase these passes for your enjoyment through a grant from the office of Senator Kenneth LaValle.




