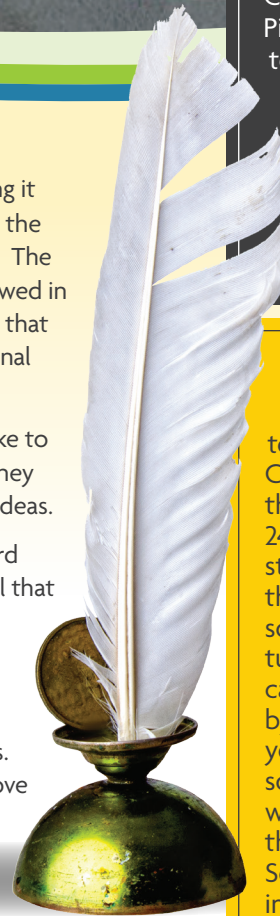
APRIL IS NATIONAL POETRY MONTH

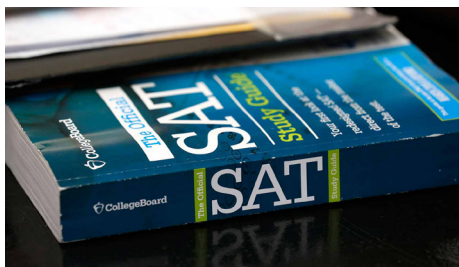

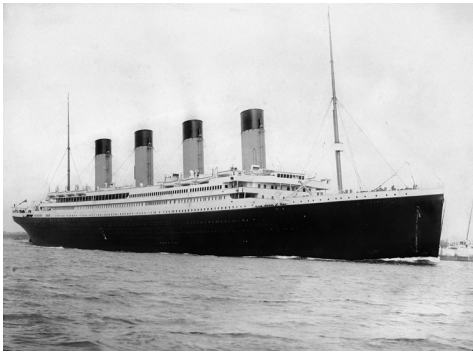

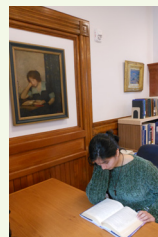
