His dedication helped secure the financing necessary to realize the dream of renovating our current space. He helped steer the library through the difficulties of dealing with Covid. With this in mind, we are eagerly seeking new members to our board of trustees and hope that members of our community will step forward and join us. The Southold Free Library is fully open since the renovation and Covid, and continues to provide programming for everyone in our community.

Our budget vote will be taking place in May and we encourage everyone to support our library by voting. The annual budget for the 2022-2023 fiscal year will be in the amount of \$1,127,673 which stays within the 2% tax cap as is in keeping with the Southold School.
