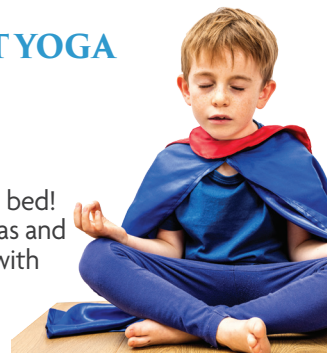

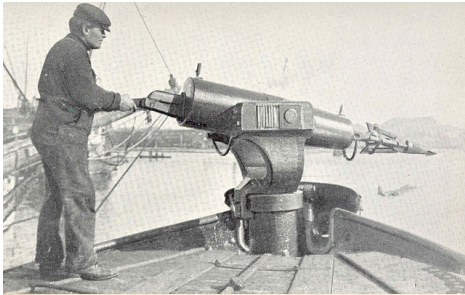

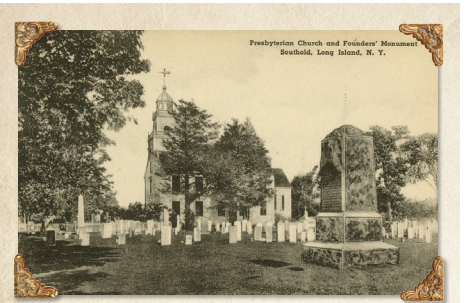

IN THE LOCAL HISTORY ROOM

Dilettante by Edward August Bell (1862-1953)

Oil painting

American painter and illustrator born in New York. He is best known for his full-length portraits and genre paintings.

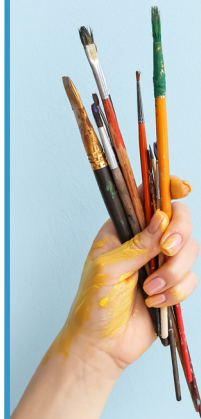

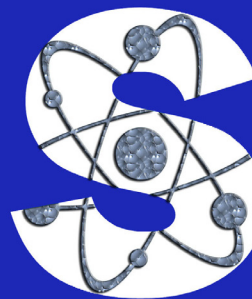
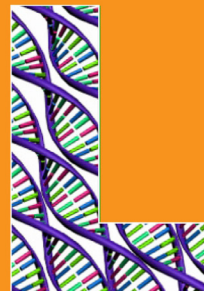
September is Library Card sign up month! If you live in Southold or Peconic, you can get a Library card. Here's how:
