
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THE WHITAKER HISTORICAL COLLECTION

The above photo shows the Southold Savings Bank, built in 1891, following a late 1890s snowstorm. Note the iron bars on the windows of the one story brick edifice. The bank outgrew the building in 1925 and built a new structure further east. The Southold Free Library moved into the empty building and opened to the public in December 1928.
